### About DR. ASSAD MEYMANDI

Assad Meymandi, MD, PhD, DLFAPA, is a noted psychiatrist, humanitarian and philanthropist whose syndicated monthly column "Meymandi at Large" relates his interests in medicine, art, religion and philanthropy to the lay and medical communi ties. As an adjunct professor at UNC Medical School and a noted physician of neurology and psychiatry, he has played an active role in extending knowledge and endowing the sciences, arts, and humanities of the region for a number of years. Dr. Meymandi is a trustee of the National Humanities Center and

serves on the board of the NC Humanities Council. The Meymandi philanthropy program has established, among others, the Andre Malraux Chair of 18th Century French Literature at the Sorbonne and is in the process of endowing the Meymandi Chair of Ideas and Curiosity for the UNC System. His current projects include building a 200-unit housing complex with school and community center for survivors of the Bam disaster in his native Iran, in addition to the expansion of the Touring Exhibition Center of the North Carolina Museum of Art (NCMA). In recognition of his tireless efforts, the International Affairs Council is honored to name Dr. Assad Meymandi the 2010 Citizen of the World.
